#### **FAMILY ASSISTANCE**

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$10,036,694.60 for 35,844 children for the month of July. This included payments totaling \$8,891,590.77 for 30,039 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$922,616.48 for 3,909 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$222,487.35 for 1,896 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$280.01.
