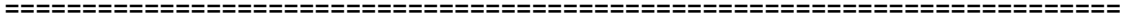

FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$6,816,243.94 for 31,659 children for the month of November. This included payments totaling \$5,969,053.27 for 26,581 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$690,359.09 for 3,408 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$156,831.09 for 1,670 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$215.30.
