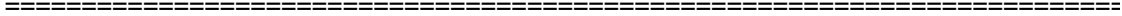

FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$7,996,938.79 for 29,114 children for the month of July. This included payments totaling \$7,144,597.42 for 24,793 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$677,531.12 for 2,886 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$174,810.25 for 1,435 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$274.68.
