FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$7,505,149.59 for 30,521 children for the month of March. This included payments totaling \$6,657,153.32 for 25,895 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$694,715.69 for 3,143 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$153,280.58 for 1,483 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$245.90.
