A total of 18,489 families with dependent children with an average of 2.31 recipients per case received payments averaging \$187.39 for the month of May. In these 18,489 families there were 42,661 recipients, including 31,995 children, who received payment. The average monthly payment was \$81.21 per recipient.

FAMILY ASSISTANCE

Payments by the Department for child care of children totaled \$6,430,571.74 for 27,050 children for the month of May. This included payments totaling \$5,964,255.43 for 24,360 children in Licensed Child Care Centers, \$406,133.16 for 1,904 children in Family and Group Day Care Homes, and \$60,183.15 for 786 children in Informal Care. The average monthly payment per child was \$237.73.

The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program, established by the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (PRWORA), required states to provide work and training services to recipients of Family Assistance (FA). Called JOBS in Alabama, the program emphasizes work activities and employment of recipients. Child care and other supportive services are available to JOBS participants. The Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 (DRA) made significant changes to TANF requiring states to operate a more intensive JOBS Program and drastically increased the documentation and tracking requirements.
